## Youth opportunity (Grades 7-12th) to learn about native culture & perspectives

Youth (grades 7-12) and their leaders from the Greater Northwest conferences – Alaska, Oregon-Idaho, and Pacific Northwest – are invited to come together for a unique opportunity to get to know one another as they learn about and serve the Yakama community July 16-21 for a S.L.A.M. Trip on the Yakama Nation reservation in Wapato, Washington.

Mending Wings, the largest faith-based native youth ministry in the country, will host this trip with native staff who will offer orientation to native culture and give an indigenous perspective on missions and Christianity. S.L.A.M. is an acronym for Students Learning About Mission. As youth and their leaders go to the reservation, it is an opportunity to go with a mindset of openness to learning as they serve.

During the S.L.A.M. Trips week, cultural activities will include a native craft taught by a local artisan, a drum circle and traditional dance by members of Mending Wings, and a traditional salmon bake. Historical and cultural site visits include the Yakama Tribal Museum, a longhouse, and Fort Simcoe (the site of an Indian Agency boarding school).

Examples of service projects of past years include:

- Building wheelchair ramps for the elderly.
- Pulling the brush in yards for the fire safety of elders.
- Removing carpets in an elder's home to prepare for new flooring.

### Holy Week and Easter Season Overview

### April 2 - Palm/Passion Sunday 9am



We begin our Holy Week with a Sunday service of lessons and music designed to invite us to join in the celebration of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, to reckon with his betrayal as his disciples turn against him and flee, and to grieve along with the witnesses at the cross as he is crucified. 10 lay readers will join me to help guide us all through the whole Passion Narrative from the Gospel of Matthew beginning with the

Palm Procession and ending with Jesus' death. The Traditional Choir and Bell Choir with be offering special music and we will join together in singing a number of congregational hymns. As always, this service will be livestreamed and available on both our YouTube and Facebook pages.

## April 2-8 - Stations of the Cross in the Fellowship Center

Following worship on Sunday, all are encouraged to join in a time of Coffee Chat in Room 115 and explore the *Stations of the Cross* that will be set up in the Fellowship Center for the duration of Holy Week. These self-guided *Stations of the Cross* are designed to lead you through the Passion Story in Mark's Gospel and provide an interactive spiritual discipline at each station. Each station invites you to reflect on the scripture in a different way - examples include Lectio Divina,



walking the labyrinth, and praying a mandala. If you choose to participate, please know that you are welcome to do the stations in order, pick and choose, and/or visit the stations as often and for as long as you desire through the week. All the stations are accessible or have an accessible option. The Fellowship Center will be open the following days and hours:

Sunday, April 2 until 12pm

Monday through Wednesday from 9:00am to 3:00pm (during office hours)

Thursday and Friday 9:00am to 7:00pm
