

Dear Valley Methodist Friends,

I'm thinking that for me personally this coming Easter will be the best Easter ever! That's why Lent was invented in the first place you know. The Bible doesn't say 'thou shalt have Lent before Easter.' Lent was created as a 'long enough flow of time before Easter' that brand new Christians could deeply study what they were committing their life to. Their baptism on Easter Sunday would make Easter a personal, life-changing experience of Jesus' resurrection for them. The best ever!

Our Tuesday night Lenten class here at our church has been equally deep. We've been studying John Wesley's epic sermon, "On Working Out Your Own Salvation" – in which he preaches this text, "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling. For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure". [Philippians 2.12-13 KJV] The passage comes alive in amazing ways in every part of his sermon. But probably the most practical application, for me personally in this year 2022, is the confidence Wesley has in the presence of Christ in the soul. To your soul, my soul, and in a "prevenient" way, the soul of every human being alive is delivered Jesus Christ himself – by God's own will and action, every day.

To a world in which most people walk around believing their identity is formed by the thoughts in their head, John Wesley offers an alternative: Christian spirituality. Christian spirituality is the gift God brings you in this moment by sending you Christ within – an artesian well of agape love. Not merely thoughts of love, not a Hallmark card of love, not a poster about love to hang on your wall, not a scripture of love to memorize – actual present Spirit love you can discover within your own heart, body, mind and spirit. Charles Wesley described it this way in Hymn #183 – "O may Thy love possess me whole." If you pray those seven words every day between now and Easter, this Easter could be the best Easter you've ever experienced.

Dear friends, all of the good words we have to share with the world, all of the good works that we want to get busy doing, everything we witness to as a church is fully defined, described and taught in this simple teaching. I couldn't be prouder of you as a congregation – because you stand for this love, this possibility, this hope for the world. May this Easter be the best you've ever experienced! so grateful to be,



United Methodists and others wishing to provide humanitarian assistance to the Ukrainian people in the wake of the Russian invasion of their country may contribute to **Advance #982450**, UMCOR International Disaster Response and Recovery.

This fund will provide direct assistance to those in Ukraine as well as assistance to Ukrainians fleeing to neighboring countries.

You can do this by making your check payable to the church with Advance Project 982450 in the memo line.

One hundred percent of all Advance contributions goes to the designated cause.

The United Methodist community in Ukraine, though quite small, is actively engaged in assisting neighbors in need. UMCOR is in direct conversation with Methodist leadership in Ukraine, Hungary, Poland, Romania and Slovakia. United Methodist churches in these countries are already assisting internally displaced people and refugees within and from Ukraine with food, water, shelter and other needs. UMCOR has approved grants that will immediately strengthen these efforts.
