Renten Preview From The Rastor's Desk

"Shadows...the place where light and darkness meet, where light is obstructed. A place we fear to go and where we guard ourselves against unseen threats and hidden dangers. A place our faith calls us to journey into each Lenten season. The prophet Isaiah wrote: "The people living in darkness have seen a great light. On those living in the shadow of death, a light has dawned." But if our light has dawned, why must we return to the shadows, why must we retell stories of woe and walk through the valley of death? It wasn't so many weeks ago that we were praising the light of the star that led the wise men to the manger where the Christ Child, our long-awaited Savior was born! Why must we turn from its light so soon?

"Because on that very night where the Star of Bethlehem filled the sky with a blinding brilliance, the shadow of the cross was already forming. Already the powers of this world were conspiring to eliminate any trace of God's Promised One for though the light of heaven was shining, the darkness of the world could not understand it. And so, even on that holy, star-filled night, the shadows began to gather. What began in that humble little cattle shed in the City of Bread was a sacred journey of obedience, sacrifice and love that ended on a rugged cross in the City of God. Love came into the world to shine the light of God but also to show that the shadows of this world cannot overcome it.

"This is why we tell the whole story each year – why we set aside a season to remember that there is no dawning light, without the darkness of the shadow of death. To remember that our faith isn't built on the birth of Christ alone, but also on his death – a death that brought the gift of salvation for all of creation. A gift given freely and without expectation of reward. A gift we all too often forget to honor. And so, this Lenten season, we are invited to "come to the shadows" to remember how Jesus was welcomed into Jerusalem by crowds crying of "Hosanna" and sent to the cross by their same cries of "Crucify him!" How friends who professed loyalty to the end, slunk into the shadows the first sign of trouble. How he shared a cup in the flickering candlelight of a Passover meal knowing silver had already been exchanged for his life. How the shadows of night hid the shameful faces of his disciples who couldn't keep awake and who gave him away for a kiss. How a secret late-night interrogation hid the light of justice and set in motion events that led to Jesus' sacrificial death upon the cross.

"Already the shadows are gathering, already the journey begins...will you come? Will you come to the shadows? Will you remember the life and death of our Lord? Come...come."

These are the words that will call us to gather in the growing darkness of the sanctuary as we begin our Ash Wednesday service at 7pm on February 14 and embark on our journey into the season of Lent. As the echo of "Come…come" fades, the music of the "Song of the Shadows" cantata by Joseph M. Martin, that has inspired our Lenten series, will lead us onto Jesus's path to the cross and encourage us to remember that on the other side of the shadows and darkness of his passion, is the dawning of the Easter promise.

The inspiration for this series goes way back to 2019, when retired pastor Rev. Roger Hudson (then at Covenant UMC), called together some of the pastors and music directors in the Spokane area to propose the idea of doing an Inland District Holy Week cantata performance of the *Song of the Shadows*. We put together plans for Lent 2020...and though we had to cancel those plans due to COVID, the calling to offer this worshipful Lenten worship experience never went away. Last fall, following conversation with Rev. Sheila Miranda and Mary Jane Shervais, Cheney UMC's Director of Music and the 2020 cantata director, we agreed that the time was right to resurrect our plans and offer the experience on Palm Sunday of *this* year with Mary Jane Shervais once again conducting the mass choir which includes many members of our own Traditional Choir. There's more information in this newsletter - we hope you can join us on March 24th at 4pm here at Spokane Valley!

And, of course, on Easter Sunday, we will walk "out of the shadows" of death into the light of the resurrection…but until then, you are invited to journey into shadows. Will you come?





About the hymn - God Will Take Care of You by Wes Holmquist

In my mind's eye, I can still see the young cowboy in JC Penneys in 1951, paying for a new pair of beautiful black and white cowboy boots with 20 silver dollars. Whenever we needed reasonable clothes my mother took her family of ten children to JC Penney's (probably not all at once though). We took silver dollars for granted back then, and also took for granted the JC Penney clothing store. But JC wasn't always a success. In the great depression of 1929, he nearly lost everything. His business deals went sour and Penney became overcome with anxiety and insomnia. He developed a painful case of shingles and was hospitalized. His mental state deteriorated until, as he later said, "I was broken nervously and physically, filled with despair, unable to see even a ray of hope. I had nothing to live for. I felt like I hadn't a friend left in the world, that even my family turned against me." But one morning he heard singing coming from the little hospital chapel. The words of the song said, "Be not dismayed whatever betide / God will take care of you." Entering the chapel, he listened to the song, to the scripture reading, and to the prayer. "Suddenly something happened. I can't explain it. I can only call it a miracle. I felt as if I had instantly been lifted out of the darkness of a dungeon into warm, brilliant sunlight." From that day forward, JC Penney was never plagued with worry, and he later recalled those moments in the chapel as, "the most dramatic and glorious twenty minutes of my life." He later became one of America's greatest merchants. True story from "Then Sings my Soul" by Robert J Morgan.
