## FOR THOSE 70-1/2 OR OLDER HERE'S ONE GREAT WAY TO FULFILL YOUR YEARLY ESTIMATE OF GIVING

Are you age 70-1/2 or older? Do you have a traditional IRA (not a Roth IRA) to which you have contributed pre income tax monies? If so, you are probably familiar with the Required Minimum Distribution, or RMD, which is a calculated amount of money that you MUST withdraw each year from your IRA account. If you fail to do this, the IRS can and will fine you! Good IRA managers will inform you about the RMD requirement and amount, which changes from year to year. While the monies invested in a traditional IRA are pre-tax, the monies withdrawn, including RMD monies, are generally taxable.

However there is a way to avoid having to pay Income Tax on monies withdrawn from your IRA, including the RMD monies. This is legal if you make a QCD distribution. QCD stands for "Qualified Charitable Distribution". The key wording here is that the check from your IRA account must be made out to the receiving charity and it must be cashed by them in the same year that you are making the withdrawal from your IRA. A charity must be a 501(c)(3)organization to receive tax-free IRA charitable contributions.

This is a great way to fulfill your yearly estimate (pledge) of giving. You could make your QCD withdrawal monthly, quarterly, or semi-annually. Just don't wait until the end of December to do it!

Another caveat; if you itemize your tax return, you cannot claim a deduction for these QCD monies. This seems obvious; you already got a break by not having to pay income tax on that money.
