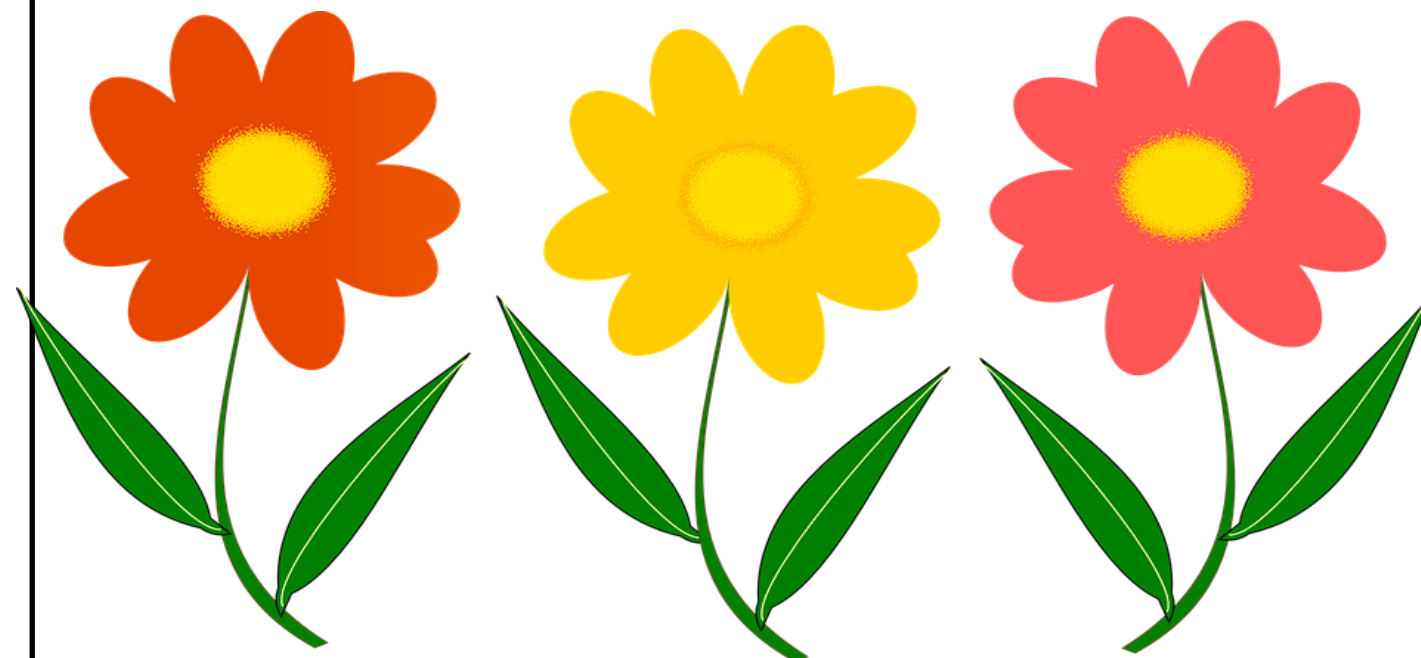

Dear Valley Methodist Friends,

It has been one of the great honors of my life to serve as your pastor these past 12 years. For myself personally, it's also been a gift of God's grace that God chose me to come to Spokane Valley UMC for this last chapter of my professional career. There are a few things that are quirky and interesting as I look back and reflect:

* I've been able to stay longer in every appointment since coming out of Drew seminary in 1987. One year in Wenatchee; three in Colfax; five at Spokane: Covenant; six at Vancouver: Salmon Creek; eight on the Vancouver District; and twelve at Spokane Valley. I've enjoyed most of these years, and survived 2 churches that (like with horses) tried to buck me off.

* God did not bless me with all of the natural gifts needed to be a good pastor. But what I lacked in natural gifts, I was able to somewhat compensate for by acquiring skills – which required great patience from my early congregations especially.

* I've been incredibly lucky that never in all these years has any church that I've served paid less than 100% of conference apportionments. This is a tribute purely to the laity, not to me. But it kept the DS off my back every year, thank you!

* Landing here 12 years ago was a bit of coming home, and a bit of coming to a place I've 'never been before'. 'Never been before' because the role of a pastor is so unique – and of course I had no idea what your journey as a congregation actually had been. My 10 years here as a child and youth from 1964-74 were years where I received all you had to give. Now it was time to help you give to others. I praise God for you dear congregation, because you received what I was able to do well, and put up with what I have always done poorly and continued to struggle with, with you, and you were committed and gracious from beginning to end.

Last week I had a wonderful moment all by myself in the downstairs choir room, searching through file cabinets for particular choir anthem. I didn't find the choir anthem, but I found a file folder with my mother's handwriting on it. She had an unmistakable left handed way of writing. And there it was, from the years that she had directed the Methodist Youth Singers, 1972-74 (I think). So as we come full circle and my last Sunday of June 12 approaches, I am filled with a sense of awe and wonder – at how astonishingly blessed I am to have been your pastor these past 12 years. I believe one thing with all my heart: your best years as a congregation are ahead of you! Hope, Trust, Joy, Outward Focus, and Intentional Diversity will be used by God's Holy Spirit as he shepherds you to new adventures I cannot even conceive of, with your new Pastor Alissa Bertsch.

Can't wait for these Sundays of May, one at a time, to come! Come join me, let's have fun together! I'm so grateful still today to be, Your Pastor, Mike Graef

presence of a loving God.

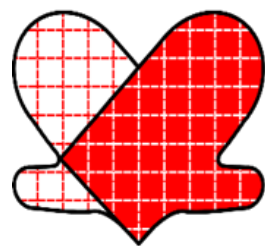

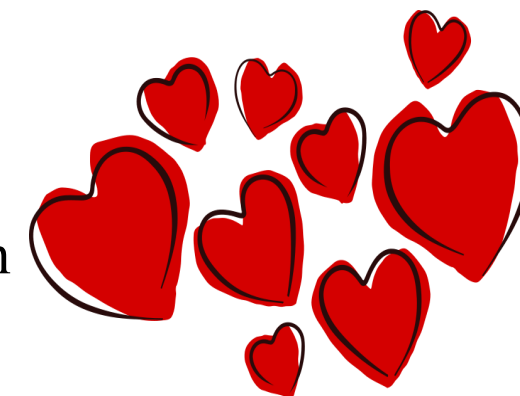

ANNOUNCING AN ALL-CHURCH CONFERENCE, for Spokane Valley United Methodist Church. Meeting to be led by DS Rev Daniel Miranda, and other leadership as he appoints.

Sunday, May 15, 11 AM, in the Chapel, with two items of business:

1) To set the pastor's compensation and accountable reimbursement budget amounts, for the second half of 2022.

2) To ask the gathering to receive a motion, second, and vote up or down, the recommendation of the ad hoc SPR/Finance/and Trustees team to sell the church-owned parsonage, and appoint the Board of Trustees to lead and complete the sale as they see fit, representing the All-Church Conference and the entire congregation in their actions with full support.

Spokane Valley UMC's All Church Conference accepts as a quorum those who are physically gathered in the Chapel at that hour. Every member of the church has voice and vote, every constituent, friend and worshipper has voice. No votes shall be included from those not present.

MOTION: that the All-Church Conference of Spokane Valley United Methodist Church hereby directs and authorizes the SVUMC Board of Trustees to lead and complete the sale of the parsonage at 10915 E 24th Ave – with all haste and priority of greatest stewardship of income for our church.

WHEREAS:

1. Our incoming pastor, Rev. Alissa Bertsch, has declined to live in the parsonage – having her own house for she and her family to live in.
2. SVUMC is now to be guided by the UM Book of Discipline in all matters related to the proceeds of the sale of the parsonage.
3. The ad hoc committee's recommendation is to sell rather than rent out the parsonage.
4. Investment of the capital from the sale will produce interest which can be used to provide Rev. Alissa Bertsch and other pastors to follow with a housing allowance.
5. The amount of principal can be used for capital improvement projects in the future, as approved by the All Church Conference of SVUMC in that future time.
6. United Methodist churches who sell their parsonages often never need a parsonage again, but continue to provide housing for their pastor through a housing allowance.
