We know it's tempting to push forward, hoping the grief will fade with time. But what if gently holding our grief invites healing we didn't trust was possible? What if learning how to walk with grief creates room for new perspectives on our present moment? All are invited to spend time with UMC pastor, Rev. Jenny Smith, author of "Still Here: A Poetry Memoir of Grief & Love," as she reflects on the nature of grief through her poetry.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It's a pretty common thing to be watching the news and have the reporter interview an "eyewitness" to gain details about something that has occurred to someone else. Usually it's a car accident, a medical emergency, or an act of violence that they observed and are now being asked to share what they saw, what they heard, and what they did in response. Eyewitnesses are often able to provide vital information to help first responders and law enforcement piece together the details of who and what caused the incident with an aim toward restoring justice and peace. When we read the Gospel accounts of the death of Jesus, they are essentially doing the same thing serving as reporters who have collected the stories of those who were there on that fateful day from the chief priests who condemned him, to the soldiers who crucified him, to Simon of Cyrene who carried his cross. Like modern day reporting, each Gospel writer tells the story a little differently depending on which eyewitness accounts they collected, yet altogether, they provide a richer picture of what transpired on that first Good Friday.

As we embark on our journey through the season of Lent at Spokane Valley UMC, our Lenten series based on Witness at the Cross: A Beginner's Guide to *Holy Friday* by Amy-Jill Levine, will invite each of us to transport ourselves back two thousand plus years to the events of that dark Friday in Passover and serve as eyewitnesses to the death of Jesus. Rather than just read the story all at once on Palm/Passion Sunday or in Holy Week, we will spend all seven weeks at the foot of the cross observing Jesus' last hours alongside the primary eyewitnesses who were there that day.

From the scoffing priests to the doomed thieves, from the dutiful soldiers to the devasted "beloved disciple", from the faithful women to Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus, we will join the crowds of people gathered that day and open our eyes, ears, and hearts to experience the crucifixion of Christ as it happened. Through scripture, study, worship, and spiritual disciplines, we will open our eyes to see, as they did, the agony of Christ, the sky turning black, and the tears upon the faces of those who loved him.

On behalf of the whole Finance Committee, we want to give the congregation a big THANK YOU for their amazing financial support! Once again, due to your faithful giving, we were able to meet all our financial goals and obligations for 2022. Your financial generosity has made it possible for the church to carry out our ministry and has made a difference in the life of our church and helped us fulfill our commitment to the greater community around us.

We are well into 2023 and we thought it would be important to share some of the goals that were set for this year and share our commitment to keep you all informed of our progress throughout this year. The budget that was approved this year has a projected expense of \$387,094.00. While this is slightly more than we received in pledge card estimates, based on the history of previous budgets, we felt confident that we could meet the goals set by the various committees that serve the church.

In January our income was less than our budgeted need; we needed \$32,258.00 and the actual was \$27,435.00. However, expenses were less than budgeted and we spent only \$30,720.00. It's important to note that these differences in income and expenses are similar to differences in past years at this point in the year and we have faith that these numbers will move closer to budget by June.

As we reflect on our faith-based budget, it brings to mind a few verses from Proverbs 11:24-25: "One gives freely, yet grows all the richer; another withholds what he should give, and only suffers want. Whoever brings blessing will be enriched, and one who waters will himself be watered." The riches of this church are many in no small part due to all who have been and are a part of financial supporting our ministry. May we continue to be a richer community through our ongoing support in 2023.
