Dear Valley Methodist friends,

As I write to you today, I'm riding the pastor "high" of having been able to speak to quite a few of you this very Tuesday morning, the day of our Drive-Through parking lot missions event. After nearly a year a bumping around this church building as if it were a monastery, to actually see people and talk to them and offer a blessing face to face is over the top happiness! So I'm going to pretend that we're all in worship in the sanctuary, and I have just a few announcements:

Several people we're connected to have changes coming in their lives that in some ways affect us. Revs Gregg Sealey and Rev Joanne Coleman-Campbell - the two District Superintendents in eastern Washington and northern Idaho - will, after July 1, no longer be District Superintendents. Gregg is moving into an independent ministry/business venture in personal and professional coaching. Joanne is retiring. This means on July 1 we will have a new District Superintendent. We already know his name: Rev Daniel Miranda. But get this: Daniel Miranda will be the District Superintendent of the entire region of Eastern Washington and Northern Idaho. He will be DS of two districts. Inland (our district) and Seven Rivers (to the West of us). Daniel is 1/2 of a clergy couple. His wife Rev Sheila Miranda will also have a conference position. Changes such as having one DS serving two districts are happening all over the West, as the cost of supporting a superintendent increases. Good stewardship in the 21st century means DSs must do their work in new ways. We may see less of Daniel Miranda than we did of Gregg Sealey, but Daniel will be great for our region. Also you may have heard that our Bishop Elaine Stanovsky will be retiring at the end of this calendar year. So in 2022 we will also have a new Bishop.

One more quick thing. Our staff and church leaders are constantly working on being ready to reopen for Sunday worship, Youth Group, Children's and Adult Sunday school classes, small groups, and the full range of ministries of our church. Our DS Gregg Sealey is coaching us to be aware of the coronavirus danger color which is being applied to our County. We want the color to be yellow or green. Currently Spokane County is orange. So as you read news sources close to home, please peel your eyes on any changes in Spokane County. Yellow or green are a "go" for us to reopen - on a limited basis at first. So that's pretty exciting. We'll keep doing what we're doing with YouTube week to week, but we want to be poised to pounce onto that first Sunday possible – to have even half the sanctuary full will feel like heaven on earth.

I hope by now all of you have received the response card copied here below. Thank you for returning these as soon as possible. If you didn't get one, please call the church office and we will send one right out to you. When we get to yellow or green and have our first Sunday back in sight, we will proceed to contact those who have indicated they want to be here on that first Sunday back. Everyone is encouraged to stay in their own comfort zone. Many of you will choose to stay home until Phase 4 – even if that is in 2022. May God guide us all to choose exactly the right ways to venture out into public life which can keep each one safe. God is everywhere, not just at church. "In him we live and move and have our being." Acts 17.28

DAUGHTERS OF DORCAS




Sandy Sprague has graciously accepted taking the lead of the quilting group, Daughters of Dorcas.

Sandy and her team are currently putting together (and a few are ready) complete quilting kits for an at home quilting project.


