

2022 Charge Conference Information

Our 2022 SVUMC Charge Conference will go a little differently this year...with DS Daniel Miranda continuing to preside over two districts, he has requested a more stream-lined and time efficient process this year. To that end, our Charge Conference will take place over Zoom on December 8th and only the elected leaders from our Church Council (including at-large members) and the Coordinating Council will attend. FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Over the summer, we spent 12 weeks learning from a number of Old Testament prophets who were commissioned by God to the challenging work of being stewards of God's Word and thus sent forth with the task of keeping God's people in line with that Word. Through metaphor-filled messages, images of impending gloom and doom, and (thankfully) a few beautiful visions of what God's love for is like, we experienced how the prophets' faithfulness to deliver God's Word often put them on the margins of society but also ultimately helped the people of God draw closer to the heart of God. The stories of how our ancestors in Israel navigated the challenges of life and faith with the help of the prophets both encouraged us in our faithfulness and emboldened us to stay close to God's calling in our lives.

As we head into a season of considering how we will be faithful stewards of our resources, we're now going to turn to another group of inspiring ancestors in the faith: the saints! Many churches set aside time in the Fall for their traditional stewardship campaign as the timing provides for ample preparation of the year of mission and ministry to come. When you know what you have to work with, you're better able to anticipate what you can accomplish for the building up of the kingdom of God! A few months ago, when I looked at the calendar to begin planning that important work, I noticed that the first Sunday of my proposed Stewardship series fell on October 30 just two days before the church would traditionally celebrate All Saints Sunday. This confluence led me to think about a stewardship series I had done in the past several years ago in which the lives of some ancient and modern saints were used to inspire the people of God to see stewardship in a new way: *Exploring Stewardship with the Saints*, a Fall worship series offered by the General Board of Discipleship!

What's fun about this twist on the usual stewardship sermon series is that it avoids the pitfalls of sounding like any of the other pleas for cash we hear in our daily lives – whether from a political campaign, a local charity, or a family member who is perpetually short on funds. Rather than focus on the same conversations around money that we've all heard before (in church or anywhere else), this series invites us to tell some stories that we likely haven't heard before - stories drawn from the lives of Christians stretching back from the twentieth to the first centuries of the church. These exemplars of the faith did not think in terms of obligatory "gifts and service," dedicating some portion of their income to the offering plate.
