"Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

(Acts 2:46-47).

It has always struck me how quickly the early church grew! As soon as the Holy Spirit passed through the people gathered in Jerusalem on that first Pentecost, the Book of Acts records that thousands upon thousands were added day by day. These new converts would gather every day in the temple courts, their homes, the local synagogue, seemingly anywhere, to teach and learn from each other, pray and worship together, break bread and talk about their newborn faith. As they grew in their discipleship, they would come to embrace the fruits of the spirit and commit themselves to living together in unity, harmony, generosity, and partnership to bring forth the Kingdom of God. And you know...they might just have been on to something!

Turns out doing things together is what we're supposed to be all about, and the Book of Acts isn't the only place in the Bible in which Christians are encouraged to be in relationship with other Christians through small groups. Throughout God's Word there are constant reminders that the people of God are called to worship together, eat and fellowship with one another, and learn from each other because that's what actually helps us grow in our faith and encourage us in our Christian witness. Because this was so important to God, from the very beginning of his ministry, Jesus drew people together into small groups for the purpose of teaching and learning, praying and worshipping, eating and talking! It's clear from his witness that he never intended his followers to go it alone –

companionship was something Jesus nurtured in his disciples because he knew that having a partner in the faith can help you when you experience doubts, questions, struggles and more.

Mature disciples will tell you that we absolutely need other Christians in our lives to challenge us, support us, and help us understand what it means to live a life for Jesus. The gift of small groups is that it gives you a space to go deeper with what we're exploring in worship, encourages you to dive into the Bible and ask tough questions, and can even aid in navigating the challenges of living a righteous life in this world. But more than that, when you're part of a small group, you have the opportunity to also encourage others and help them make sense of the tough parts of living the life of faith, too!

If you've never been a part of a small group, or it's been awhile, the start of the new school year is a perfect time to join one! As I've (hopefully) already demonstrated, being a part of a small group or Bible Study can be a source of enrichment in your life and help you grow in your faith. But let's be honest, joining a small group can seem intimidating, time consuming, or simply not important compared to other obligations. As your schedule begins to fill with family responsibilities, work demands, and more this Fall, it might seem impossible or challenging to fit in one more thing. But, talk to anyone who has been a part of a small group and they will tell you that it is totally worth it - that adding this *one more thing* actually brings value to your life and can even *lessen* the stress of all the other demands.

DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY: *Disciple* is a program of disciplined Bible study aimed at developing strong Christian leaders. The study gives the Old and New Testaments equal time emphasizing the wholeness of the Bible as a revelation of God. Drawing upon the work of scholars combined with personal Bible reading and study by the participant, plus dynamic group discussion, this study group aids in understanding the overall scope of the Bible. *Disciple* Bible Study is a commitment of 3 to 4 hours a week of independent study and preparation for a 2-hour weekly group meeting held over 34 weeks. 
