Pastor Alissa's Message - Advent in August!

If you read my August Worship Preview in last month's newsletter or you joined us for worship on June 20th, then you know that on August 11th, we will be starting a new worship series that's going to be both totally different from our usual summer worship...but also VERY familiar!

As I have previously mentioned, our church has been asked to host the first of three worship design trainings to be held over the next year for smaller or layled UM churches in the **Pacific Northwest Annual** Conference. The "Small bites, BIG FLAVOR: Skillsets and Mindsets for M-M-Good Worship (No Matter the Size)" worship planning retreats are designed to teach laity and clergy alike how to create dynamic, engaging,



and multi-sensory worship for all seasons of the year whether it be Advent/Christmas, Lent/ Easter, or Ordinary Time. These workshops will be taught by Dr. Marcia McFee, renowned United Methodist author, worship designer and leader, professor, preacher, and artist, as well as the creator of *Worship Design Studio*, an online resource for worship design.

During my last semester at Claremont School of Theology I had the opportunity to take a class from Marcia. Though she only taught at CST for one semester, boy, did she have an impact on my ministry! I will never forget our first day of class as she led us all outside to join together in a drum circle and singing songs of the Christian tradition, ancient and new, as a way to remind us that we are part of a chain of holy people linked through the eons by our calling to lead people in the worship of God. Her way of teaching was so inspiring, so engaging, so embodied, I looked forward to it week after week and learned SO, SO much from her. When I continued into ministry, both on college campuses and in the local churches, it was my lessons from Marcia (Cont. on pg. 2)

(Cont. from pg. 1) that inspired my own approach to worship creation whether it be "rich traditional" (as I call our form of worship) or something more modern. So, if you're ever wondering where I get these crazy ideas from experiential Stations of the Cross or having us all eat a peppermint in the middle of the sermon moment as we ask each other "do you taste what I taste?", now you know!!

Truly, one of my favorite aspects of ministry is worship creation! I really enjoy sourcing from other creative types or designing my own worship series with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, crafting or seeking out liturgy to give us words for our worship, and collaborating with our lay musicians and leadership to offer it Sunday after Sunday. I especially like getting to learn more about scripture as I research and prepare my sermon message. But what I really LOVE is when all the various elements come together (by the power of the Holy Spirit, of course!) to offer a worship experience that touches on all the senses, connects us to God, and provides us all a variety of ways in which to engage the spiritual focus for the day so we leave worship full of love, hope, peace, and joy! The truth is, some of us learn through listening, others through visuals, and still others through song and dance. If we take seriously the call to create worship that helps God's people grow closer to God's presence, then we need to keep that in mind as we plan our services!

But here's the thing - not all churches have the resources we do or even a pastoral leader with the time and talent to plan dynamic worship week after week, which is where hosting the "Small Bites" workshop comes in! As I shared in my sermon "In Need and In Abundance" a few weeks ago, I believe that we at Spokane Valley UMC have an abundance of worship blessings including but not limited to: gifted musicians, eloquent liturgists, and an updated, accessible, and BEAUTIFUL sanctuary! Meanwhile, other churches, who may have an abundance in another area of ministry, find themselves in need regarding worship inspiration. This series of workshops with Marcia aims to help with that! The particular training that we are hosting August 16-18 will be designed to help these churches plan to offer a dynamic Advent & Christmas experience for their churches and communities this coming December. It intends to help them visualize how they can transform their sacred space so the visuals have an impact, how to engage established members and welcome new people, as well as curate an experience where all can deepen their connection with God through worship. To help Marcia help them, we've been asked to not only offer our facility for the training and provide snacks on Saturday, but to transform our church into the manger at the inn where Mary and Joseph birthed their holy child so folks have a visual of what's possible!

Because I love all things Marcia McFee and feel strongly called to help build up struggling faith communities, I've invited you all to join me in fully embracing this invitation to help empower other UM churches *and* take advantage of this opportunity to help us deepen our own relationship with God by offering a special summer celebration of the Advent & Christmas season here at SVUMC using the same worship series provided with the training: *The Inn: Housing the Holy!* As a bonus, Marcia and workshop participants will worship with us on August 18th! 


