Advent at SVUMC by Pastor Alissa

Happy Advent! As we prepare for the birth of the Christ Child this year, we're going to be doing something a *little* different than the Advent series of the past – we're turning to pop culture! Many of my clergy colleagues have taken this route with sermon series based on beloved Disney movies, popular TV shows like Ted Lasso, and theologically heavy fictional books like "The Lord of the Rings" but this will be the first time that *your pastor* has embraced this lens through which to view our story with God! To guide us this season, we're turning to a book by author and pastor, Rev. Matt Rawle, who created the *Experiencing Christmas* series we did two years ago. He's kind of an expert, if you will, on integrating pop culture references with Christian theology – in fact, he has a whole "Pop in Culture" series of which our Advent one is a part!

Through this series Rawle seeks to help churches explore what role God plays in our culture both in our day-to-day lives and in the work of our hands that produces music and art, literature and plays, plus movies



and technology. Throughout history, people have debated and drawn a dividing line between the "sacred" (that which is explicitly religious in nature) and the "secular" (everything else). At first glance, the dividing line may seem obvious, but when we stop to examine what God has to say about this division, we might be surprised to find there's quite a bit of intersection!

Scripture says that all things were made through Christ (John 1:3), and through Christ all things were reconciled to God (Colossians 1:20). In other words, everything and everyone in our world contains a spark of the divine - everything is sacred, and whether or not we choose to live in that truth depends on our perspective. Through Jesus, God put on flesh and walked among us, in our world, in order to re-narrate what it means to be a

child of God. On Christmas God entered into human culture and transformed it. So now all is sacred, and we are invited to see and proclaim God's glory in everything. Rawle truly believes we are called not to reject the culture we live in, but to *re-narrate* its meaning - to tell God's story in the midst of it.

In *The Heart That Grew Three Sizes*, Rawle takes a look at Dr. Seuss's beloved children's story, *How the Grinch Stole Christmas!* in a new way - through the lens of faith. On the flip side, Rawle also uses this beloved Christmas classic to help us understand the redemption and salvation offered to us in Christ, and how the birth of God's Son brings peace, hope, love, and joy. Whether we identify with the Grinch, sympathize with him, or feel aversion to his character, we can learn from his journey as he comes to understand that Christmas is more than what he originally thought. Over the four weeks we will look at four themes based on his journey: "When Everything Is Wrong", "When Christmas Isn't Christmas", "When Light Shines", and "When Joy Is Our Song". Each Sunday we'll have several main scriptures to guide us – a "grinchy" one from the prophets and more encouraging ones from the Epistles and/or the Gospels. We will also have the opportunity to sing "Welcome Christmas" from the movie as we step over the threshold into the Advent journey each week and light the candles of peace, hope, love, and joy.

You've likely already heard that there is a devotional book written by Rev. Matt Rawle that accompanies this series. I invite each individual or family to pick up a copy at the Connect Desk for a (Cont. on pg. 2)


