The Year in Review...and The Year Ahead! by Pastor Alissa

What a year of ministry and mission we had in 2025! I had more fun exploring our annual theme of "The Heart of Spokane Valley" than I could have ever imagined and was blessed to learn so much more about who we are at our core and the opportunities the Spirit has invited us to consider as we build a heart for our city. I hope you have felt the same! As we make the turn from 2025 to 2026, I'd like to dedicate this article to looking back at some of the highlights from the last year and wrap it up with a look into the next!

Worship

With our annual theme as our guide, we embarked on a number of worship series inspired by the inner work of connecting ourselves to the "Heart of hearts" and the outer work of extending God's love to others. A few of my favorites were On A Mission to Love Others, Return to Me With All Your Hearts, and The Heart of Christianity. While I might be the only one, I also loved our series on evangelism, Meet the Goodpeople: John Wesley's Seven Ways to Share Faith! The Heart of Neighboring series, which was inspired by materials and leadership provided by new(ish) member, Dr. Shawna Beese (new mayor of Millwood), got us doing "window work" to be better neighbors and together we put forth a proclamation to the City of Spokane Valley to designate Sept. 28 National Good Neighbor Day for our whole community! And I know we will never forget the year we stepped over the threshold into the season of Advent with an unexpected but well-known personality to guide us: the Grinch! The Heart That Grew Three Sizes led us to douse the sanctuary in "grinch green" and reflect on some of the "grinchier" scriptures of our faith – all of which worked to prepare our hearts to truly welcome the Christ Child at his birth on Christmas Eve! By the time you get this newsletter, we will have sung "Silent Night" with our candles, our hearts swelling the with peace, hope, love, and joy of God With Us!

Staff Changes

While worship requires a lot of time and dedication by our staff, this year also kept our Staff/Parish Relations Team and their Chair, Joyce Johnson, VERY busy! We blessed forth Luke Henderson (Director of Music), Samantha Anglin (Coordinator of Children's Ministry), Cassandra Strickland (Nursery Care), and Jackie Florian (Sunday School, Coordinator, and then, Associate Coordinator, of Ministries with Young People). Meanwhile, we welcomed Betsy Pletscher to the role of Director of Music, Zachary Bjurstrom as our Church Accompanist, Jen Price as our Coordinator of Ministries with Young People, and Chris Nilles as our Nursery Caregiver.

Amongst all these staff changes, we experienced some unexpected and delightful growth to these ministry areas! God keeps sending us new families and individuals to join us in our mission which means Betsy has been hard at work recruiting and equipping our children and youth to join the sacred music ministry of the church while Jen is expanding our program to help them walk with Christ.

All The Rest...

When we weren't worshipping and reordering staff, we were keeping on with the aspects of ministry that have always been and always will be at the heart of who we are. We hosted Hospitality (Cont. on pg. 2)

(Cont. from pg 1) events including Epiphany and Advent Holy Pubs, a Mardi Gras Coffee Chat, and a special National Good Neighbor Day full of activities for members of all ages, we've had lots of fun together as a faith family! Small Groups and Disciple Bible Study kept on meeting and, of course, we've continued to nurture our heart for serving others through mission and outreach as we've deepened our partnerships with many "Ministries that Matter" like Shalom Ministry, Mission Community Outreach Center, and Broadway Elementary.

Our facility has also been busy! In the Spring, a faith community from the Marshall Islands approached us about worshipping in our historic chapel and using the gym for teaching traditional dance and music to their youth. A few of us recently joined them for their celebration of the day the Good News came to the islands on Dec. 7, 1857, and we were treated to both dance and song plus handmade crowns and jewelry made from shells! And I'd be remiss if I didn't mention all the work the Trustees and Finance Teams had to undertake due to vandalism to our HVAC system and Education Entrance. We now have a whole new system in place plus a new security fence and door!

On to 2026...

There is so much to celebrate in 2025, and though I couldn't name it all in this one article, it's time for us to look forward to 2026! After much prayer and patience in which I awaited the Spirit's inspiration for our 2026 theme, I finally figured out what our overall focus is

meant to be: *Transformed By Grace, By Grace Transforming.* Based on the final part of our mission statement: *We are here to invite people to transform the greater community through the grace of God,* we will spend the next year exploring how God's grace works in our lives – both *within* us to transform us into faithful followers of Christ, but also *through* us to transform the whole world into the kingdom of God! We'll kick off our new annual theme on January 11 with a five-part series called *Transformed by Grace* where we'll learn how we are changed by the work of God's grace both as individuals but also as the Body of Christ!



In closing, I want to thank you for the past year of mission and ministry at Spokane Valley UMC. It continues to be a great blessing to serve as your pastor! The grace and acceptance you've shown me is a gift I cherish day by day. I'm also deeply grateful to our staff who support my ministry and partner with me and our leadership to fulfill our mission as a church! 


FEBRUARY 8 – 5TH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY



United Women in Faith

United Women in Faith shall be a community of women whose purpose is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.





Thank you to the nearly 40 women who attended UWF's Annual Christmas Luncheon, and thanks especially to Rev. Peter Imathiu who delivered the talk! We heard from so many how impactful Rev. Imathiu's words were and wanted to print a portion of it here. If you would like to read the full presentation, find Rev. Imathiu or Madelyn Bafus.

"On one hand, Christmas season in Kenya when I was growing up in the 1960's and 1970's was full of meaning, ancitipation, and hope. On the other hand, it presented a devastating sense of sadness and despair. My sense of sadness and despair was associated with social-economic disparity that became so well pronounced at that time. One could clearly identify the impoverished member of the society and the rich people by the way they dressed, the kind of food they were able to access, as well as how they carried out their social activities. My family and I came from the cadre of people who lived on less than a dollar a day. In other words, I was "swimming" in abject poverty kind of background.

My family and I found a sense of meaning and refuge at church. In my church, we were not the only poor people present. The emphasis of the church's teachings was not anchored on material wellbeing but on spiritual health. We ate and drank from the same kind of dish, utensils, and cups and sat on the same pews. Few days before Christmas Day, there used to be a young adult group going round the neighborhood singing

Christmas carols. Every Saturday there would be the enacting of the prophets that had prophesied the coming of Jesus, the birth of Jesus and the Holy Family. A day before Christmas, we used to attend the carol service and have a delicious dinner. On Christmas Day, we would attend a Christmas service that comprised of singing, presenting a play about the birth of Jesus Christ, and the appearance of Father Christmas who gave both the children and the adults at least two candies. Also, the Women's Fellowship of the Methodist Church in Kenya donated blankets and foodstuffs to the impoverished members of society and especially the elderly. In all of this, singing Christmas hymns from the Methodist Hymn Book and reading the Christmas story in the Bible left indelible memories in me."
