2024 Pacific Northwest Annual Conference Report by Zack Reiber, Lay Leader, and Pastor Alissa

We had the opportunity to travel to Central United Protestant Church in Richland, WA to represent Spokane Valley UMC at the 2024 Pacific Northwest Annual Conference held June 13-16. This was Zack's first time and Pastor Alissa lost count years ago, but it's been more than 20! In case this is your first time encountering information about Annual Conference, the UMC Book of Discipline defines "the purpose of the annual conference is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the

transformation of the world by equipping its local churches for ministry and by providing a connection for ministry beyond the local church; all to the glory of God." While much of our connectional work happens throughout the course of the calendar year, this important once a year meeting of laity and clergy from all the churches and extension ministries in the PNWAC helps us to remember where we've been, reorient ourselves to each other, and set a course moving into the future together - all to the glory of God! Below is a day by day accounting of our experience and the highlights we'd like to share!

Day One

Annual Conference this year brought a lot of affirmations and changes following the actions of the



2024 General Conference. We began our time of holy conferencing by joining in worship with Bishop Cedrick Bridgeforth offering a powerful sermon introducing the Annual Conference theme of "BEing Well." The message focused on the Scripture from the Gospel of John 4:4-17 (Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well) and he encouraged us to consider (Cont. on page 2)

(Cont. from pg. 1) how we can "be well" and take care of ourselves as leaders and a community, so as to better serve those around us, by drawing from the deep well of God that gives us living water.

During the Laity Session on the first day, Zack joined with the other lay members to vote for a new conference lay leader. There were three candidates presented to replace Nancy Tam Davis after her 8-year term. It was decided that Falisha Hola, a young adult from the First Tongan UMC of Seattle, shall be the next lay leader of the PNWUMC. We are all very excited for the work ahead as she brings another unique perspective to the incredible work that Nancy has been accomplishing! **Day Two**

During the second day, there were reports from the *Commission on Ethnic Ministries*, the *Board of Congregational Development and Church Vitality* (this included an excellent video on the Congregational Equity Cohort that we, along with Ali Norris, are part of), and the *Church Properties Task Force*. These three reports were focused on the revitalization of the church and spaces. After the morning plenary, there was an opportunity to join in a worship celebration of those who are retiring and to witness to the traditional passing of the "Elijah/Elisha" mantle from a retiring elder to one of the elder candidates who would be ordained on Saturday.

In the afternoon, there was a video sharing the work of the Hispanic/Latinx Ministries, and reports from General Conference delegation about the actions of the GC. This includes the removal of harmful language restricting the ordained ministry of LGBTQIA+ candidates and the giving of sacramental authority to deacons. The move towards regionalization was also discussed and how it will require each of the AC's in the UMC to vote to affirm it in order to modify the church constitution. A *Creation Care* update was also offered with information on how they will be providing a variety of supporting information about grants and programs for churches to better care for our Earth. Additionally, Petition #11, *Environmental Stewardship from the Ground Up*, and Petition #12, *Creating an Environmental Commission*, were passed following a recommendation of concurrence by the pre-conference Focus Sessions. Day Two ended with the approval and prayer for Lapwai, Nezperce, and First Korean of Seattle UMCs to faithfully conclude their ministries.



Day Three

Day Three's plenary began with a point of personal privilege by lay member, Joey Lopez, who felt that there should be more holy conferencing in the annual conference sessions. With the shift to a hybrid model, some of the traditional forms of conferencing have been lost while great access has been created, Bishop Cedrick Bridgeforth affirmed that they would take what Joey said to heart. Next in the schedule was the Ministry Fair (tabling event) and the Central United Protestant Church's Children's Fun Run in which participants ran while others threw color chalk on them. Bishop Cedrick joined in and ended up being a living rainbow by the end! (see picture to the left).

The day concluded with our final plenary in which we entertained Petition #13 concerning establishing healthy working standards for clergy (including (Cont. on pg. 3)

(Cont. from pg. 2) those in extension ministries) by redefining a standard work week at 30-35hrs (not including memorials, conference responsibilities, and crisis pastoral care). The motion passed with unanimous support. Petition #14, which pertained to edits in the conference's rules, was sent back to the Rules Committee for additional review.

Special guest, Dr. Glenn Paraso from Mary Johnston Hospital in the Philippines, came and discussed the deepening partnership between the Philippines and the Greater Northwest Area. This included passing a resolution with the Filipino people that advocated contacting our representatives to urge against U.S. tax dollars being used to fund worsening human rights and a humanitarian crisis in the Philippines.

Bruce Galvin, Conference Benefits Officer, and Kristina Gonzalez, Executive Director for Innovation and Vitality, were also honored for the amazing work that they both have done and the legacy that they leave and encourage as they prepare for retirement in the next year.

Day Four

The final morning of Annual Conference was filled with the *Service of Commissioning and Ordination* in which elder and deacon candidates are blessed and sent forth into ministry. It was a moving and tearful celebration of life commitment and a joyful expression of the future of the UMC. The church is beginning a season of welcome for LGBTQ+ siblings and service not only welcomed new pastors and deacons into ministry but was also a defining moment heralding a commitment to begin anew. Guest preacher Rev. Dr. Lydia Muñoz, the executive director of the Plan for Hispanic/Latino Ministry for the UMC, delivered a personal, genuine message of hope for the church using the week-long theme of "Be Well."

All in all, we had a really wonderful experience at AC reconnecting with established friends and making many more! Thank you for receiving our report and for allowing us to represent our church!




