Treasure

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus' Sermon on the Mount comes very soon after Jesus begins his ministry in Galilee and right after he calls his first disciples. The word about his ministry of "healing and curing disease and every sickness" spread quickly and crowds started to gather in his wake. Matthew tells us that when Jesus saw the crowds, he took his new-to-following-him

disciples up the mountain and began to teach them while the crowds listened. Jesus covered all kinds of topics – who is blessed in the kingdom of heaven (hint: those poor in spirit, mourning, hungering for justice, and so forth), how they are the salt of the earth and light of world, and how his teachings aren't meant to abolish the law but *alter* it so that true righteousness is the outcome.

He also spent quite a bit of time in that sermon on how to practice *piety* or in plain speak, devotion to God. While there's the expected emphasis on the

best way to practice prayer to stay in right relationship with God, there's also a strong emphasis on the best way to practice *finances* to stay in right relationship with God. Recognizing that many things competed for our attention and relentlessly tempted us to put our reliance on them vs. God, Jesus counseled his disciples "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth...but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven...For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matt 6:19-21). We often assume that it works the other way - that our treasure will follow our hearts, but Jesus suggested something altogether different. He said that where our treasure goes, whether it be our time, money, and/or energy, our hearts will follow. It's no wonder, then, that many of us feel a sense of tension between the practices of our faith and our financial practices. We want to invest our lives in our relationship with God, our family, and our church community....yet our hearts too often, without us even realizing it, feel drawn to focus on our debts, our bills, our jobs, our other financial obligations. The end result is we feel no closer to God or to our purpose as followers of Christ; instead we feel guilty, conflicted, and resigned. (Cont. on pg. 2)

(Cont. from pg. 1) God desires so much more for us than to be struggling under the burden our financial realities bring. Jesus, out of love for those God's loves (US!) cared about our hearts, so he talked about our treasure differently than the way the rest of the world was talking about. And what Jesus had to say was liberating, transformative, and inspiring! As we enter into our annual stewardship season during the month of November, we're going to explore what Jesus said and about money and why it's less about how much we have but how we orient ourselves to it through the perspective of our relationship with God. The aim is for us to wrestle with that tension of what we want to be investing in and what we actually are investing in – because at our core, each of desires to experience the power found in making God our treasure.

This is why our Financial Resources Support Team has chosen *Treasure*, a worship series developed and implemented by Rev. James Armstrong at Providence United Methodist Church in Mt. Juliet, Tennessee for our Fall Stewardship Series. At the time, Providence was a new church start with a two-year-old congregation who had reached many who had previously felt disconnected from God and the church. Their leadership realized that if they wanted to help people experience transformation in their lives, they would need to be like Jesus! To nurture the hearts of God's people and help them see what they truly treasure meant they would have to talk about their finances. As a growing church, they had many financial needs and big dreams but sensed that a traditional stewardship campaign would not be the most effective way to help new followers understand the role tithing has in the life of the church. It seemed that if they based their appeals on the need to fund programming, or even out of duty to the church, they would not connect with the hearts of their members.

It occurred to them that the answer could be found in the words of Jesus as spoken during the Sermon on the Mount where, as I noted above, Jesus provided a beautiful and nonshaming way to talk with people about their finances and the invitation to give back to God. Rev. Armstrong's church began by asking themselves two key questions: What do you want to be investing your life in? and What are you investing your life in? They found that the answers to these two questions were very different. Clearly, their hearts were following their earthly treasure, no matter how much they wished they were following their heavenly intentions. As they considered changing where they were investing their treasure, both individually and as a church family, they found that their hearts were filled with excitement and a growing sense of contentment. Not only that, but their church experienced an amazing season of growth! A number of people made life-changing decisions about their treasure that had transformative effects on the way they lived and the way they gave. Giving increased significantly and continued to go up following the campaign. More than that, lives were changed. Young families made decisions to tithe who had never heard that term before. Retirees gained a different view of their investments and the impact they could have on the world for God's kingdom.

Rather than keep this faithful way of engaging finances to themselves, they wanted to share it and I'm glad they did because everything they experienced is what our Financial Resources Support Team prays for our congregation. We want everyone who comes to our church to have an encounter with Jesus and to receive his life-changing and powerful ancient words about how to be in relationship with God by identifying and prioritizing what the Heart of Hearts truly desires for us. As we spend time this season discussing and praying about our treasure, our hope is that we will see hearts that are stretched, conflicted, and empty find their true home in God! "Giving Your Treasure Back to God" - Sue Magrath preaching on Matthew 6:1-6 (Pastor Alissa will be out of town this Sunday)


