## October 2025 Newsletter "National Good Neighbor Day and New Fall Worship Series"

Way back in April during our post-Easter worship series, "Meet the Goodpeople: John Wesley's Seven Ways to Share Faith," one of the newer members of our congregation, Dr. Shawna Beese, was prompted by the Spirit following the sermon where I addressed the loneliness epidemic in the U.S. to share with me about an upcoming national holiday called "National Good Neighbor Day." Have you ever heard of it or observed it? It was signed into law in 1978 by President Jimmy Carter and is observed annually on September 28. The goal of each National Good Neighbor Day is to engage a city or township's citizens, business owners, and organizations, including churches, in the work of repairing and building up the social fabric of communities across our nation through intentional acts of neighborliness.

Shawna, who has a Ph.D. in Public Health and serves as the Assistant Professor of Rural Health Promotion for WSU Extension, follows a calling to promote neighborliness as a means to address public health issues like the rise of loneliness and related chronic diseases. As a member of the City Council in Millwood, WA, and a current candidate for Mayor, she has been getting the word out about National Good Neighbor Day and has been working with a team of



local residents and business owners to coordinate a weeklong series of neighborly events for her community. She even got the current mayor to sign a Good Neighbor Day proclamation! Having been inspired by our evangelismbased sermon series back in the post-Easter season, she thought that our congregation might want to do the same for Spokane Valley!

Our leadership and some key staff members met with her and we were compelled by her enthusiasm and the opportunity she was offering us to help (Cont. on pg 2)



(Cont. from pg. 1) build up the neighborly heart of our city. As any resident of Spokane Valley knows, there is no true geographical "heart" of our community – there's no downtown, no "cute" part, no central area out of which the rest of the city grew. It's simply a municipality established 21 years ago out of a previous rural area that was increasingly overtaken by Spokane-proper's urban sprawl through the decades. That is starting to change, and our church just so happens be right at the heart of it: two blocks from City Hall, right next to the still-under-renovation Balfour Park, and kitty corner from the brand new Spokane Valley Library, which altogether are lending themselves as an anchor to a growing geographical heart of town. Given our key location and mission to love others, we've been spending this year exploring how we can be a part of building the growing "heart of Spokane Valley," and National Neighbor Day is just the opportunity we had been praying to receive!

After our leadership and staff said "Yes!!" to Shawna's offer to learn more about Good Neighbor Day, she passed on to us all kinds of resources – several books, helpful handouts, information about the Hopeful Neighborhood Project, and a copy of the City of Millwood's Good Neighbor Day proclamation she helped get signed. Inspired by everything we received, we set about drafting our own National Good Neighbor Day proclamation for Pam Haley, Mayor of the City of Spokane Valley, to consider signing. By the time you receive this newsletter, she will have done so at the Tuesday, Sept. 23 City Council meeting!

We also determined to turn this one day observation into a whole Fall worship series so we could go deeper into our calling to be good neighbors. On Sunday, September 28, we will begin a new series called "The Heart of Neighboring" in which we will explore what scripture has to say about how people of faith are called to engage with their neighbors. Guided by a book called "The Art of Neighboring: Building Genuine Relationships Right Outside Your Door" by Jay Pathak and Dave Runyon, and using resources provided by the Hopeful Neighborhood Project, Shawna, Zack Reiber, and I will offer five sermons to help us learn new ways to grow a spirit of neighborliness where we live, both in terms of our individual homes and our church home. That same day at 4pm, we will continue the fun with an afternoon of events including a neighborhood scavenger hunt, a no-host dinner gathering for adults 21+ at 45 Degree Brewhouse, and a pizza party for kids and youth at the church to celebrate National Good Neighbor Day. We're also hoping to hold a screening of the Mr. Roger's documentary, "Won't You Be My Neighbor?" in the Chapel (please note the film is rated PG-13). It is our hope that this year's events will grow into a whole city-wide week of neighboring events in 2026 and a

reaffirmation of this year's proclamation – stay tuned!

At a time where there is much that is threatening to divide us, leaving many people feeling isolated and alone, taking intentional steps to build up our neighborhoods is an antidote we as a church family can offer that promotes connection and kindness in our community.

Observing National Good Neighbor Day and dedicating a month to becoming even better neighbors is a great way to do that! Please plan to join us!


